USA, California, Sonoma County: Winter Releases

This small report features recent and upcoming releases from Sonoma County, mostly from the 2021 vintage. The growing season was defined by cooler, relatively even temperatures and continued drought, which resulted in lower yields due to smaller berry size. "It was a Goldilocks vintage," Catherine Kistler of Occidental Wines recalls. "It was the best quality and quantity, especially sandwiched between 2020 and 2022," two seasons afflicted by historic wildfires and heat waves, respectively.

Stylistically, the 2021s are reminiscent of the 2019s, with notable aromatic detail and concentrated flavors at lower alcohols. It's difficult to make generalizations across such a large county with so many microclimates, grape varieties and styles, but after tasting hundreds of wines, my impression is that the 2021s are particularly chiseled, with loads of ripe tannins and focused acidity. As a result, the wines are perhaps technically elite, but at this early stage, they offer a touch less expression and personality than the wines from 2019—readers will notice a fair number of plus marks attached to these scores. I suspect it will take several years for many of these wines to unfold to their full potential, but it's an ideal vintage for moderate to long-term cellaring.

"The wines in 2021 are like a perfect mashup of 2018 and 2019," Kistler explains. "There is fruit and that immediate appeal of the 2019s, but they are finer and finessed, chiseled and salty, like in **O** Support
